

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
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

A General Drilling and Pump Installer Class Will Be Offered at the Annual Meeting





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for your Company's Safety Meeting Anticipate Accidents

From NGWA's Safety Talks and The Hartford

One of the key words in accident prevention is "anticipate." By anticipating what could happen, it's possible to take safety steps to prevent an accident.

One of the steps we can take is to investigate all near-miss accidents. We should always be on the lookout for unsafe practices and for accidents that do not result in injury.

Injury analysis proves that, in the average case, for every mishap resulting in an injury, there are many other similar accidents that cause no injuries.

One study of the problem revealed that for every major injury, there is an average of 329 other opportunities to eliminate the problem. This means that an employee, either because of his or her repeated unsafe action or repeated exposure to an unsafe mechanical condition, suffers on the average 300 no-injury accidents and 29 minor injuries before a major lost-time injury occurs.

Other studies have indicated the opportunities to prevent

a major injury can be as high as 600 incidents.

So, we see that accidents do not have to result in injury. But, they are strong indications that something is wrong. If not remedied in time, they may very well result in a major lost-time injury.

We know that accidents without personal injury, however minor they may be, occur frequently. They have the same causes as personal injury accidents, and they can be prevented in the same ways. They are expensive and add to the cost of production. Preventing these accidents is important.

When an accidental injury does occur, unsafe practices probably had previously been committed. There probably had also been previous narrow escapes. If you stumble, fall, and sustain an injury, chances are that this was not the first time you stumbled and fell.

If you have a near miss while driving your car, do you take corrective

action to prevent the same type of near miss from happening again? If not, you should. If you find yourself hitting your brakes in a panic stop, it may very well be that you are following the car ahead too closely. You should take action to prevent this from happening again.

How many times do we need to have a narrow miss before we get the message? If we really believe in safety and want to avoid personal injury, one near miss should be enough.

Near misses or no-injury accidents, as well as injuries, must be investigated.

Report all accidents to your supervisor. If you don't, eventually the law of averages will catch up with you...changing that near miss into a serious injury.

So, let's try to anticipate what could happen by being aware of near misses and reporting them. In this way, we all can play a big part in preventing accidents.







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




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LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

The last year was a busy year. As you are aware, Jeff Smith and I talk with our lobbyists from Greenberg/ Traurig (Mark Glaser and Josh Oppenheim) on a regular basis.

In the fall of 2016 the Governor had announced, via a press release, that he intended to introduce legislation requiring testing of private wells. Little details were given at that time. In January 2017, the Governor's State of the State address and the Executive Budget Proposal included the proposal to regulate private well testing. ESWWDA decided not to outright oppose the legislation but make some recommendations for modifications. January to March of 2017, meetings were held at DOH, DEC, the Governor's Office and the Senate and Assembly to advance the ESWWDA positon concerning the water quality bill. In April the Legislature rejected the Governor's proposal regarding the testing of private wells.

Greenberg/Traurig opened many doors for us this past year. Our voice has been heard and lines of communication are open for future issues. The plan for 2018 is to work with DOH to prepare effective private well educational materials consistent with our general positions and to continue to advocate against proposals that are harmful to the well drilling industry. It is our hope in 2018 to continue our conversations with DOH and DEC as there have been staff changes in both agencies over the past few years. Beth Guidetti has now taken over **Dan Kendall**'s role in the Water Well Program. Dan continues to work at DEC but will be working on other projects and assisting Beth when needed. Last week, I "met" Steve Marshall, via conference call who is Ben Pierson's replacement in Water Supply.

We hope to see you at the **Annual Meeting at Turning** Stone in January 2018. Mark Glaser will be outlining our legislative plans for 2018 year. It looks like it is going to be another busy year.

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

Albert H. Mack Scholarship Guidelines

Guidelines for the establishment of the scholarship fund and awarding of scholarship monies for ESWWDA:

A. Scholarship Fund

- 2. One thousand dollars per year to be set aside until the fund reaches \$7,500.

B. Awarding of Scholarships

- 1. Preference to be given to sons or daughters of association members.
- 2. Preference to be given to students attending 2-year programs.

- 4. Persons may make application to the scholarship committee only after acceptance at an accredited school, offering a program related to the water well industry.

Accredited Well Driller/Pump Installer Program

- Sign an affidavit established for this voluntary program.
- Must submit five (5) continuing education points as established for this voluntary program, obtained during the year prior to renewal.
- Two (2) of the five (5) points must be from an ESWWDA sponsored event.


Points can be accrued by the following methods:

 - one point per hour of instruction.

- 6. Presentation for a community service
 - one point each presentation.
- Z. Participation in groundwater related webinar
 - one point per hour instruction.
- 8. Presenting an education class or webinar
 - one point per hour instruction.
- Other acceptance of points will be at the discretion of Accredited Program committee.
