Charles Crover stated that he had given the Board a detailed treasurer's report. The business of the association was in good standing. Dave Root made a motion to approve the treasurer's report. Jim Dwyer seconded the motion. The motion was passed.

President Chris Root thanked the membership for attending the meeting and the demo. He has been coming to this museum since he was a little boy, just like he was attending drillers' meetings. At 16 years old he would drive there to pick up casing. This location and now the museum are very important to him. President Root informed the membership that there is a great deal happening with the DEC regarding proposed changes to the regulations regarding revisions and inclusion of the geothermal drilling. Communications: The association received thank you letters from **David Hovancik** and his granddaughter for their well. Copies of the letters will appear in *Hole Talk*.

Sickness & Health: It was reported that David Bruce Tompkins, Richard Tompkins' uncle, passed away. Jim Utter said he had one employee who died in an auto accident this summer and one who was diagnosed with leukemia. It was reported that David Chugg was not doing well.

Insurance & Safety: Analisa Bastiani-Jesco stated that she had two speakers attending the Annual meeting. One is Bill O'Conner who will be doing OSHA updates and Gene Devine who will be speaking regarding pollution liability.

Membership: Julie Boyd reported that we have a <u>total of 287 members</u>. The year 2025 ended with a total of 163 contractor members with only 27 unpaid; a total

Pump Installer Primer Classes

Will Be Offered at the Annual Meeting, Tuesday, January 13th

At the Annual meeting of the Empire State Water Well Driller's Association, we will be offering classes.

Preregistration is required one week in advance and classes must have a minimum attendance or classes will be cancelled. Registration deadline is January 2, 2026.

The class will cover the Water Systems
General and the Pumps under 100 gpm exam
for pump installers. Please note exams are not
given on-site. You must schedule the test on your own
and in advance.

Completion of this class and general firsthand experience will enable you to prepare for the required NGWA exams. Licensing for any person operating a drill rig or performing pump work is a DEC requirement.

Class size will be limited. Registration will be \$50 for ESWWDA members and \$80 for non-members. Any member who has already taken any of the primer classes offered in 2002 through 2025 may retake the class for \$40.00. Payment can be made with cash, check or credit card (MasterCard or Visa). Onsite check-in begins at 8:30 am.

New York State Environmental Conservation Law ECL \$15-1525 requires the following:

- Water well drillers and pump contractors must be registered with the NYS Department of Environmental Conservation.
- After a well is drilled, contractors must provide a DEC well completion report to the well owner.
- At least one certified individual must be on site during well construction, pump installation or repair to either.
- Water wells must be constructed in accordance with NYS Department of Health rules and regulations (link leaves DEC website).
- Water well drillers and pump contractors are subject to General Business Law 36-A, which regulates home improvements.
- The NYS Health Department has Fact Sheets on Protection of Water Wells (link leaves DEC website).



Hand Protection

From NGWA Safety Facts Sheets

Two of the most intricately designed instruments that we work with are our hands. We probably couldn't use any other devices that can take the beatings our hands take and still turn out precision maneuvers.

Like most things of marvel, we have come to take our hands for granted – except when we get our fingers pinched in a door or between two bowling balls. Then we remember that our hands are not only present but sensitive, too. Unfortunately, we soon forget this experience and start taking them for granted again.

It might surprise you to know that hand injuries account for one-third of the two million disabling on-the-job accidents which occur each year. Most of these hand injuries are caused by pinch points – 80% of them, in fact.

Pinch points have the nasty habit of catching us when we aren't looking, or more appropriately stated, when we're not paying attention. Pinch points can be avoided by being aware of their existence and then taking the proper precautions.

Another precaution to take for hand protection is to wear approved work gloves when handling rough materials and during other operations where your hands are directly involved in the lifting or moving of objects. Still other safety measures include taking time to remove or bend down protruding nails, splinters, and sharp edges on materials you're going to be working with.

Of course, machine guards and the special tools given to you to perform your job should be utilized. When you don't lock out machinery which you have to reach into, or when you remove a guard and don't replace it, you're positively increasing the odds that you'll be injured, and any bet you make against yourself is a poor one.

Hand protection isn't anything new. It's been

considered important for years. In medieval times, knights wore armored gauntlet gloves. Later, the bare-knuckled prizefighters discovered it was easier on both parties involved if their hands were covered when they squared off. And as the game of baseball developed, the fielder's glove evolved from a skimpy piece of leather into something with considerably more padding.

Despite any precautions we may take, our hands are going to receive minor injuries from time to time, and I caution you to be treated for these cuts and scratches, as they can develop into something more serious.

However, a little foresight will go a long way toward keeping the skin on your hands. For instance, if you're moving an object, either on a hand truck or carrying it, make sure the doorways and aisles are wide enough to move through safely before starting the job. Make sure that you have proper hand clearance and be equally cautious when setting down your load.

It's advisable to keep your hands free of grease and oil. Slippery hands can get you into trouble, so if you get grease on them, clean them up right away.

We've probably all joked at some time or another that our troubles began when we put on a wedding band. This could actually be the truth in reference to our jobs. For safety's sake, don't wear rings while you're working. They can very easily catch on machinery and other objects, resulting in a badly cut finger – or worse.

Pulleys and belts form other pinch points and should be covered with guards. If it should become necessary for you to pick up broken glass, nails, or other sharp objects, handle these things with your bare hands. So, a good thing to always keep in mind is that your hands are fearless. They'll go any place they they're sent and they'll act only as wisely as the person they belong to.

Albert H. MackScholarship Guidelines

Guidelines for the establishment of the scholarship fund and awarding of scholarship monies for ESWWDA:

A. Scholarship Fund

- 1. Maximum funds available in one calendar year: \$2,500.
- 2. One thousand dollars per year to be set aside until the fund reaches \$7,500.

B. Awarding of Scholarships

- 1. Preference to be given to sons or daughters of association members.
- 2. Preference to be given to students attending 2-year programs.

- 3. Scholarships available only to persons whose course of study is related to the water well industry.
- 4. Persons may make application to the scholarship committee only after acceptance at an accredited school, offering a program related to the water well industry.
- 5. Funds may be distributed to more than one person in any one calendar year.
- 6. Scholarship funds are released upon acknowledgment of grades.

Daniel M. Shultes Scholarship Fund Guidelines

This scholarship is a one-time award to children of Contractor members in good standing who are attending college in a field of study outside the industry or areas not covered by the Al Mack Scholarship.

Awarding of Scholarships

- Preference to be given to children of Full Contractor members
- Preference to be given to students attending minimum of a 2-year program
- Persons may make applications to the scholarship committee only after acceptance at an accredited school.
- Funds may be distributed to more than one person in any one calendar year.
- Application deadline is April 1st of each year.

- Applicants are selected via a blind selection process.
- The number of scholarships and the amount of the scholarship are at the discretion of the Scholarship Committee and cannot exceed a total of \$1000 per calendar year.
- Scholarship funds are released upon acknowledgment of grades.
